
## Christmas in the Philippines


## What you need

- A4 sheet of coloured paper
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  Coloured paper for mounting
- Scissors

## What to do




1. Take an A4 sheet of paper and fold it in half as shown.



 Fold it in half again but make only a small crease to show the middle. Fold the bottom right corner upwards to make a 60° angle.


> In an isosceles triangle these two distances must be the same.




 Fold the bottom left corner upwards to meet the right edge of the paper. You will get an ice-cream-cone shape.




4. Fold this cone shape in half again.



7. Cut out a smaller right-angle triangle from this shape.You should be left with a boomerang-shaped piece.



Cut out a wedge as shown.
You need to be left with an isosceles triangle.



8. Gently unfold this piece to discover your six-pointed star! To create the tassels, fringe two 5 cm x 4 cm pieces of coloured paper (the parols pictured feature duo-tone paper). Once fringed, roll these tassels up and secure with a small dab of glue.

6. Cut off the bottom of the

isosceles triangle as shown.
