Day and Night in the Desert

In desert environments, plant and animal activities are very different by day and by night. Draw contrasting scenes representing daytime and night-time happenings in the desert.

What to do:

- 1. Working in pairs, tape four sheets of construction paper together on a two-by-two grid and lay out as follows:
 - a. The upper left section should be coloured white or light blue to represent daytime.
 - b. The upper right section should be coloured black or dark blue to represent night-time.
 - c. Both bottom sections should be coloured brown to represent the area immediately below ground.

- 2. Label the sections 'day', 'night' and 'underground', as appropriate. In small boxes, show information such as usual daytime and night-time temperatures and average rainfall.
- 3. On white paper, draw animals and plants doing what they do during the day and at night. When and where do the animals sleep? When do they eat?
- 4. Use lines to link predators and prey and to show the relationships between plants and animals.
- 5. Display your finished scene in the classroom.
