Aaron Blabey lives in Sydney with his wife and two sons. He was a successful actor for 15 years, as well as an artist, before becoming an author and illustrator of children's books.

His first book, Pearl Barley and Charlie Parsley (2007), achieved remarkable success. It won the 2008 Children's Book Council of Australia Book of the Year Award (Early Childhood) and was short-listed for both the Crichton Award for New Illustrators and the prestigious New South Wales Premier's Literary Awards. Aaron's second book, Sunday Chutney, was published in 2008 and mid 2009 saw the release of his third book, Stanley Paste.

Aaron no longer acts and has many more books in the pipeline.
