## **Create Your Own Fossil**

Fossils are extremely useful records of the past. They allow scientists to study what life might have been like millions of years ago. Fossils can leave delicate patterns and a surprising amount of detail.

Find an interesting object to set in stone, allowing its impression live on in the form of a fossil.

## What you need

- Plasticine
- 2 plastic cups
- An object you would like to use as a fossilised impression (eg, a coin or shell)
- Plaster of Paris
- Water.

## What to do

- 1. Flatten a ball of plasticine until it is approximately 2 cm thick. Make sure the top is smooth.
- 2. Put the plasticine inside a paper cup with the smooth side facing up. Carefully press the object you want to fossilise into the plasticine until it is partially buried.
- 3. Carefully remove the object from the plasticine. An impression of the object should be left behind.
- 4. Pour half a cup of plaster of Paris into the other cup. Add a quarter of a cup of water into the plaster and stir until the mixture is smooth. Let it stand for 2 minutes to thicken.
- 5. When the mixture has thickened, pour it on top of the plasticine in the other cup, then leave it until the plaster has dried.
- 6. When the plaster has fully dried, cut away the sides of the cup and take out the plasticine and plaster. Carefully peel the plasticine off the plaster. Keep it in a warm, dry place and enjoy your very own fossil!
