What you need


- Sheets of newspaper
- Glue


Sticky tape
Scissors


- Glue


What to do


- Fold the page horizontally, with the folded edge on the top. Fold the two top corners down so that they meet in the centre forming two triangles.
- 2. To make the brim, fold the top piece of paper from the bottom edge up halfway to the body. Fold the same edge one more time so that it overlaps the triangles.
- 3. Turn the hat over, and repeat the two folds on the opposite side. Tuck in the paper at each end and fasten with a little sticky tape to keep it all together.
- 4. Give each child a copy of the blackline master and have them cut out a skull and crossbone carefully, glue or sticky tape them to the side of their hat, and add feathers if they choose.











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
