




# SOLO Wildlife

## Wolf

How much taller than a wolf are you? Do you have a dog? What does it measure from its shoulder to the ground? Do others in your group/class have dogs? What are their dogs' measurements?



If a wolf weighed 40 kilograms, is it heavier or lighter than you? Is it heavier or lighter than your friends?

The wolf leaves a paw print 13cm long and 10cm wide. What are your footprint measurements?

A group of wolves is called a 'pack'. Which other animals live in packs?

Use a map to find out how big 40 square kilometres is. Now work out 1300 square kilometres.

How much bigger than wolves are the prey animals on pages 20 and 21? What is the more common name for caribou?

Put the small prey animals on pages 22 and 23 into order of size.

Research why the breeding adults are called the alpha pair. Why are they the only pair to breed?

Write about the ways that a wolf's coat keeps it warm in winter but not too hot in summer.

A wolf has 42 teeth. How many do you have? What are your teeth called?

See if you can get an X-ray of a human foot. Compare it to the diagrams on page 37.

Wolves recognise each other's voices. Get a group together, blindfold yourself (NO PEEPING!) and get someone to say something. Can you recognise whose voice it is? Let others try. Is it easy to identify someone by their voice if you can't see them?

Write about how the pack helps when cubs are born. What are some of the dangers that wolf cubs face? What is the biggest danger to adult wolves?

Find out which domestic dogs are most like the wolf.
