This poem is based on the book *Ten Little Fish* by Audrey Woods.

It is designed to highlight the plight of one of our Australian endangered animals — the quoll!

It would make a delightful assembly item, complete with quoll paper plate masks!

Your class could also use this format for writing their own poems about other endangered animals.
